

Understanding that God will never let you fail! Handout #4

We do not ever identify with our mistakes or circumstances.

1. **God is not going to let you fail! Do you have faith to believe that!**
 - A. Do not ever identify with your tribulations, test or trials (John 16:33)
 - b. When negative things happen to us, we must deny them that they can overcome us.
 - c. Jesus said he has robbed anything negative that you will face on this earth to defeat you.
 - d. We always have the right as citizens of the kingdom to expect victory! (Psalms 34:17)
 - e. Notice all their troubles. All means no exceptions. We must settle this in our heart, and mind that Gods Word is final authority in our life.
 - f. Sometimes we base our faith on what occurred to someone else. However, our faith must be based on the Word of God.
 - g. The Lord is nigh unto them that are of a broken heart; and saveth such as be of a contrite spirit. 19 Many are the afflictions of the righteous: but the Lord delivereth him out of them all. Psalms 34:18-19
 - h. Never ever identify with afflictions. Identify with after the BUT.
 - i. Even when bad things happen to the good and godly ones, the Lord will save them and not let them be defeated by what they face. Psalms 34:19(Passion)
 - j. Declare this" Jesus I receive what you did for me that under no time will the world overcome me and nothing in this world will overcome me.
2. **God expects us to trust HIM and stay in Faith and be determined to persevere or outlast the devil.**
 - A. In the last years many of us have been through tough times or h trying times in our lives. However, God will bring us through those times.
 - B. He has given us assurances in his Word And let us not be weary in well doing for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not (Galatians 6:9).
 - C. We must be careful not to give up, because this is what the devil wants. The closer we get to reaping, the more pressure to faint we will feel.
 - D. The arrival of our due is never "if," but always "when."
 - E. If thou faint in the day of adversity, thy strength is small (Proverbs 24:10).
 - F. We all have our days of adversity, but these days do not mean God is mad at us. Encountering resistance means breakthrough is just around the corner, and the devil wants us to quit before we reach it.
 - g. We need to do whatever it takes to move forward in tough times, even if doing so is painful.
3. **Our tough times do not ever change the Word of God! (Hebrews 4:13)**
 - a. There is not one person who can hide their thoughts from God, for nothing that we do remains a secret, and nothing created is concealed, but everything is exposed and defenseless before his eyes, to whom we must

render an account.(TPT)

b. Nothing surprises God. He has already made provisions in his Word!

c. no weapon meant to hurt you will succeed- No weapon that is formed against thee shall prosper; and every tongue that shall rise against thee in judgment thou shalt condemn. This is the heritage of the servants of the Lord, and their righteousness is of me, saith the Lord. (Isaiah 54:17)

d. No matter what we go through the Word does not change because God will not allow you to fail.

E. God will be your bodyguard to protect you when trouble is near. Not one bone will be broken. (Psalms 34:20) Passion

f. psalms 37:25 I have been young, and now am old; yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread.

G. You are the righteous. Righteousness is something we receive, not something we earn; we receive it only through God's favor. Our response to this is to have faith in Jesus. We do not place our faith in what we do for Jesus, but in what He did for us. (Galatians 1:6-7)

4. How does God respond to our afflictions?)

a. And the Lord said, I have surely seen the affliction of my people which are in Egypt and have heard their cry by reason of their taskmasters; for I know their sorrows; (Exodus 3:7

b. God always understands what you are going through! God sees your afflictions and always intend to do something about it.

c. And I have said, I will bring you up out of the affliction of Egypt unto the land of the Canaanites, and the Hittites, and the Amorites, and the Perizzites, and the Hivites, and the Jebusites, unto a land flowing with milk and honey. (Exodus 3:17)

d. God is always saying to us that its not over till he says its over and its never over till we win.

e. And when we cried unto the Lord God of our fathers, the Lord heard our voice, and looked on our affliction, and our labour, and our oppression:

8 And the Lord brought us forth out of Egypt with a mighty hand, and with an outstretched arm, and with great terribleness, and with signs, and with wonders (Deuteronomy 26:7-8)

f. Notice God did not leave them in their afflictions . God does not just bring us our he restores.

g. And he hath brought us into this place, and hath given us this land, even a land that floweth with milk and honey. (Deuteronomy 26:9)

h. God brought them out and into. This is Gods pattern. It does not matter how long it takes it shall happen !

i. And we desire that every one of you do shew the same diligence to the full assurance of hope unto the end(Hebrews 6:11.)

j. We are to have assurance till the end.

K. And so, after he had patiently endured, he obtained the promise. (Hebrews 6:15)

l. After -this is where we never question how long you are going to go through the circumstances. The only question we should be How long I am willing to last.

J. Abraham stuck it out and got everything that had been promised to him.(MSG)

k. Everybody wants the manifestation of the promises not everybody wants to stick it out.

5. The enemy wants to use your mistakes to mock you, but God can use them to make you.

a. Do not gloat over me, my enemy! Though I have fallen, I will rise. Though I sit in darkness, the Lord will be my light.(Micah 7:8)

b. If you let them, the people around you will define you by your failures. Do not be held hostage by your bad choices; your failure is not final!

c. It's not about falling; it's about getting back up. We are all going to fail at something at some point; we're all going to make mistakes; the question is what will you do after the fall? Will you get back up?

d. "The godly may trip seven times, but they will get up again" (Proverbs 24:16)

e. Your mistakes are a portal to possibility. God's grace is there for us to learn from our failures and grow. If we will get back up, we will see that each mistake is a doorway to discovery not destruction

f. God doesn't define you by your mistakes. Even Peter, after his worst mistake, after he denied Christ, was counted among the disciples and had his most powerful experience in the Upper Room! He was called by name after Jesus' resurrection. "But go, tell his disciples and Peter ..." (Mark 16:7).

g. There's value in restoration. Your life is a masterpiece, and your failures don't have to be final. If you will allow God to restore you, His grace and mercy will make your future priceless"...to give unto them beauty for ashes, the oil of joy for mourning, the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness..." (Isaiah 61:3)

h. You may have made bad choices, maybe you even got what you wanted ... but you don't have to keep what you got. Trade in your failures for forgiveness, pick yourself up, and press forward to your destiny. As long as you have breath, you have a chance! It may feel like the world is finished with you, but God is not! Maybe you failed, but you're not a failure. You made a mistake, but you are not a mistake. There is power is rising up after the fall.
